## Purpose

Project: IMPACT is an Indiana FFA Challenge presented to its membership, recognizing FFA chapters' active participation in community service and volunteerism.

## Scope

Project: IMPACT can include can include **but is not limited to** the following activities:

- FFA's Project PALS
- Adopt-a-Grandparent
- Habitat for Humanity
- Race to End Hunger
- Specialized Service Projects
- Adopt-a-Highway

## Application Guidelines

- Projects will run from April to April of the year applying.
- Entries will be evaluated upon number of hours volunteered, number of FFA members and number of community partners involved and a maximum two-page description of the project. No more than 5 pages of supporting evidence may be submitted.
- Entries need to be certified and signed by High School Principal, FFA Advisor(s), Chapter President and must be postmarked by **May 5, 2008**.

## Recognition:

- Media coverage of the project.
- A trip with the State FFA Officer team to work on a joint community service project
- Chapter recognition at State FFA Convention and State Fair
- Local and state news release

# Application Procedures

## Cover Sheet

Include the following items on the cover sheet:

- Chapter Name
- Project Title or Name
- Chapter Advisor Signature
- Chapter President Signature
- High School Principal Signature

## General Information Page

Include the following on a general information page:

- Activity name
- Number of Hours Volunteered
- Number of FFA Members Involved
- Number of Community Members Involved

*Example:*

<b>Activity</b>	<b>Hours Volunteered</b>	<b># of FFA Members</b>	<b># of Community Members</b>
Project PALS	30	15	20
Adopt-A-Highway	50	10	5
Canned Food Drive	10	2	100

\*A chapter may have several activities listed above.

## Project Description Section

This section will be no more than a two-page narrative of your chapter's Project: IMPACT.

The following items can be included but not limited to:

- How did you get started?
- Challenges faced?
- Successes of program?
- Impact on community?
- Dollars spent?
- Why did you select the activities you did?

## Supporting Material

This can be no more than five pages and can include but not limited to the following:

- Newspaper clippings
- Letters from community
- Pictures
